LIFE ON FOOT: FASHION HERITAGE WALKING TOUR SATURDAY 6 JUNE, 11.15AM

Camper's use of leather as a primary material is very well known. This fashion heritage walk will explore the history and heritage of London's oldest leather making district mapping a journey from Bermondsey Street to Shad Thames. Designed to coincide with Life on Foot: Camper at the Design Museum and Rayne Shoes for Stars at the Fashion and Textile Museum, visitors receive free entry to both exhibitions. Duration 1 hour.

NINE LIVES TANK TALK

SUNDAY 7 JUNE + SUNDAY 14 JUNE, 2PM, FREE DROP-IN SESSION

The Nine Lives installation in the Design Museum Tank tells the story of the design and occupation of nine workspaces each of which has been designed by an emerging Irish architect. These free drop-in talks and activities give insights into the installation and the social lives of contemporary Ireland, lives lived with, and among, architecture and design. These talks will be led by Nine Lives curator Emmett Scanlon (7 June) and photographer Noel Bowler (14 June). Nine Lives is part of the London Festival of Architecture.

THE ARRANGEMENT OF FURNITURE IN A MUSEUM: BSL TOUR SUNDAY 7 JUNE, 3PM, FREE, BOOKING ESSENTIAL

For each exhibition the Design Museum provides a British Sign Language Tour for deaf and hard of hearing visitors. These tours, given in BSL by a native speaker, offer an opportunity to explore the Design Museum's wide ranging temporary exhibition programme. In June, the museum offers a BSL tour of the SCP exhibition, The Arrangement of Furniture in a Museum.

TRAVELLING INTO THE FUTURE: WORK IN PROGRESS TUESDAY 9 JUNE, 7PM

This panel discussion uses the theme of 'Work in Progress' to examine travel and London's transport systems, taking in cycle superhighways, Crossrail, telecommuting, speed and mobility amongst other aspects of urban travel. The evening brings together Tim Fendley, who has revolutionised the navigation of the city through Legible London, and Sam Pearce, who hopes to radically alter cycling through his Loopwheel design. They will be joined by Design Museum Director Deyan Sudjic, in a session chaired by Alastair Donald, a researcher on mobility and space and the British Council's Project Director for the British Pavilion at Venice Architecture Biennale. Tickets include entry to the Designs of the Year exhibition before the talk begins.
